
### Looking ahead—

## Our Deacons Reflect the Heart of Christianity

Last Sunday Deborah Hoffman was ordained as a deacon. Deb has been serving for several months, and now is officially a member of our Board of Deacons, in service to our church and our community. What do our deacons do? Simply put, they assist those in need, both within and beyond our community of faith, through many and varied ministries. These include:

- **Visiting** those who are sick, homebound, or in nursing homes, often bringing flowers, Christmas cookies, gifts made by the children of FPC, copies of devotional, *prayers, friendship and Christian love*. Currently, nine people are visited regularly by Deacons or congregation volunteers. An additional 5 people receive frequent calls or visits.
- **Providing a monthly meal** to needy neighbors through the soup kitchen. A dedicated team plans and provides healthy meals, as well as a comfortable and cheerful atmosphere. Additionally, through donations from the congregation, we have provided toiletry items, scarves, mittens, gloves, socks and hats. Usually 20 to 25 meals are served each month.
- **Offering help** to members with emergency needs for food, shelter, transportation and occasionally, money. Meals and transportation are offered to members who are in need for medical reasons. Deacons coordinate collection and monthly deliveries to a local food pantry,
- **Providing comfort** in times of grief by sending to those who have lost a loved one, a booklet series entitled, *Journeying through Grief*, published by the Stephen Ministries. Currently six families connected to FPC are receiving these monthly booklets.
- **Coordinating receptions** for funeral and memorial services when requested.
- **Maintaining the sanctuary pews** by keeping them well stocked and tidy.
- **Communicating our love** to our church family through our card ministry.
- \* **Dinners to Help** is a new project where a group led by the Deacons gathers every few months to prepare and freeze food to have on hand for those in our church who are experiencing a family illness, incapacity, new baby, or other event where a little help would be welcome. At least six families or individuals have recently received this help.

## Sarah Beck Hill Scholarship Fund

The year 1991 brought a surprise gift to FPC that has been a great blessing to many people. The church received a generous (and somewhat unusual) bequest from the estate of Ralph P. Hill, a former Newport resident and graduate of the University of Rhode Island. The bulk of the bequest (about \$250,000) established a scholarship fund in memory of his mother Sarah Beck Hill, for students attending URI. He wanted First Presbyterian to administer the fund, and so the Session set up a separate board consisting of church members for that purpose. Dozens of students, most but not all related to church members, have since benefitted from over a quarter-million dollars of scholarship distributions.



The scholarship committee, chaired by Brian Ross, met Sunday, June 26 and voted to grant scholarships for the spring semester to **Abby Bloom** and **Victoria Johnson**. Applications may be submitted by anyone planning to begin, or currently enrolled in, a full-time course of study in a degree program at the University of Rhode Island. Prospective recipients who plan to attend URI in the Fall semester may submit an application to the board by August 1, 2022.
