# 35 years ago—

## A centennial celebration



First Presbyterian Church in the 1980s

The theme chosen for FPC's centennial celebration was "100 Years and His Work Goes On," and this thought inspired those who planned and participated in all the events leading up to the actual centennial. The first event was held March 27, 1988, when Frank Converse

presented an organ recital—the date coinciding with the 20th anniversary of the dedication of the Casavant organ.

A month later, an impressive Community Ecumenical Service was held April 24, 1988. Dignitaries and representatives from other community service organizations joined the congregation in the Sunday worship service. In the weeks that followed there was a Choir Concert, a Bell Ringers Concert, and a family Clambake. And then on Sunday, June 19, 1988, exactly 100 years after the founding, the sanctuary was filled to capacity as a solemn service of Communion was observed. People had returned to Newport from all over the country just to be a part of the congregation once again for this event.

Following the worship service there was a luncheon in the ballroom of the Sheraton-Islander Hotel. Elder Ronald Machtley (who was running for Congress that year) was the master of ceremonies, and it was a fitting climax for the Centennial celebration.

Special recognition was given to the 45 people who had been members for 50 or more years—among them Irene Meikle Patterson, who had been a member for an astounding 81 years. A special Centennial photo directory was distributed, and a beautiful new booklet, the History and Stained-Glass Windows of First Presbyterian Church, had been prepared. A commemorative banner and a commemorative tile were also made available.

All the events were considered a great success, and the celebration left a positive effect on the purpose and morale of the congregation for many years to come.
