Changing pastors—a familiar experience

As Rev. Tyler Johnson reached the 30th anniversary of his ministry at First Presbyterian, he was honored at a luncheon on March 6, 1994. He had suffered health problems and was considering, but not necessarily looking forward to, retirement. Four years earlier, with their family now grown, the Johnsons had moved out of the church manse and purchased a home in Middletown.

When he announced his retirement the following year, he told the congregation that approaching retirement had been a "very emotionally draining experience" for him. And many in the congregation were similarly emotional as they attended the large retirement party for the Johnsons on November 12, 1995. He had been the longest serving of any of the pastors of First Presbyterian.

The congregation was without a regular pastor for the next 18 months and experienced a noticeable "let-down" period. Then, a wonderful interim pastor arrived by the name of Rev. Robert Lantz. He was a retired minister who had also served as a chaplain in the Air Force during his long career.

Rev. Lantz did a fine job over the next year, shaking off the lethargy of the congregation and preparing the way for a new pastor. Under his guidance a search committee was formed and a job description was prepared for a new minister. Due to their diligence and the leading of the Holy Spirit, the next pastor of First Presbyterian was chosen about a year later.

In July of 1997, Rev. Dr. William J. Maxwell and his family were warmly welcomed to First Presbyterian.

Bill Maxwell grew up in southwestern Ohio, and he had served two congregations in Ohio before coming to Newport with his wife and three children. Although there may have been some initial adjustments between the

Midwestern and New England cultures, this change in leadership was a very good thing for the church.

The spirit of the congregation was rejuvenated, and it was soon reflected in increased attendance at the Sunday worship services. Rev. Maxwell's confident preaching style and biblically based teaching was what the congregation wanted, and needed, to hear.
