An Elder's aspiration—to be a good shepherd



In last Sunday's sermon about the role of Elders in the church, Pastor Sean Bland referred to the role of a shepherd and pointed out our beautiful and inspiring Shepherd Window.

We do not know exactly how the vision of creating our beautiful church originated, but we do know that the founders wanted to achieve an elegant building worthy of the city and of the denomination. The architectural style has been described as

"Romanesque," with a large

circular rose window in the front, and equally large stainedglass windows on either side. The interior was designed to seat more than 450 people with good seating for all and no provision for a balcony.

The 60 stained glass windows and the organ are signature features of First Presbyterian Church. To a large degree, the church was designed around them. As you approach, coming up Broadway from Newport, the windows dominate the view of the church. And, as you enter the sanctuary, the gleaming tier of organ pipes and the glow from the windows dominate the scene. There are several windows in the sanctuary and other areas of the church that depict historic events of the Protestant Reformation worldwide. They were inspired by 20-foot canvas banner decorations used in 1880 at the Pan-Presbyterian Council in Philadelphia.
