Paul: 'Jesus Did What David and Moses Could Not'

This week, Sean preached from Acts 13:13-41. This passage contains a sermon by the Apostle Paul, and Sean reminded us that the Gospel is not about what we do, but about what God has done for us.

What has God done for us? He has chosen His people, loved His people, and justified His people. These truths should each challenge us to practice humility towards others, patiently and enduringly love others, and to forgive others. Above all, though, the Gospel is a challenge to believe in Jesus for the forgiveness of sins.

Pastor Sean often has more to share with us than he is able to fit in his sermon on Sundays. Each week he will be sharing “a few odds and couple ends” in the newsletter for our further understanding and contemplation.

A Few Odds and A Couple of Ends from Acts 13:13-41

I noted in our sermon how this message 'sounds' like Paul, because of Paul's characteristic word choice and emphasis on 'justification.' Our Reformed tradition understands justification as the 'great exchange,' or the 'double-imputation' of our sin to Jesus, and his righteousness to us. When a Christian is justified, they are not transformed into a perfect person. Yet, through faith, a person becomes united to Christ and that union is the basis for God 'counting' Christ's righteousness as our own. It is, as Martin Luther called it, an 'alien righteousness.'

Paul in this sermon says that we could not be justified by the Law of Moses; that is only because we are unable to keep it. But Jesus did keep it, so that perfect obedience and righteousness is credited to the accounts of those who by faith are united to him. Praise God from whom all blessings flow that we do not have to earn his forgiveness but can receive it by nothing more than simple faith!




Learn...


