The Church is a Place for Beggars

This week Sean preached from Acts 13:41-14:7. He challenged us to be hungry for the Word of God like the Jews in the crowd that Paul preached to.

Specifically, we are to earnestly seek every week to hear God speak; we can do this daily by reading his Word but we also do that together on Sundays by hearing the Gospel proclaimed again and again.

Pastor Sean often has more to share with us than he is able to fit in his sermon on Sundays. Each week he will be sharing "a few odds and couple ends" in the newsletter for our further understanding and contemplation.

A Few Odds and A Couple of Ends from Acts 13:41-14:7

Luke the historian, writing about the response of the Gentiles to Paul and Barnabas' preaching, says in 13:48 that "as many as were appointed to eternal life believed." While we do not want to overstretch this verse. Reformed theologians have long looked to this as an example of the principle that those who believe the Gospel do so because God has called them and disposed them to do so, by opening their eyes and giving the gift of faith. This should give us confidence every time the good news of Jesus is preached, for God will draw those whom he has set apart for himself through that preaching, and nothing can stop this from happening. We can evangelize with certain hope knowing that God has appointed many to eternal life by his sovereign power!
