Rose Window Restoration Project

The Rose Window Restoration has begun. This project is scheduled to be completed in about a month, weather permitting. The work is being coordinated by Mancini Construction. As currently planned, the stained glass window will not have to be removed and there should not be any scaffolding on the interior of the church.

Session has approved \$110,000 for this repair of which \$44,100 was provided by a grant from the Champlin Foundation. The goal is to repair the window sills and framing, and replace the protective glass so that it will last for another 100 years. Everyone is reminded to stay clear of the worksite and not to climb the scaffolding.
