Do God's Plans Ever Fail?

This week Sean preached from Ephesians chapter 1. Sean showed us how Paul describes God as having a purpose in all things, a plan to bring that purpose about, and how God has predestined a people for himself. Still, even though God has a plan for all things, tragedies are still tragedies, and evil is still evil. God brings good out of it, but Jesus, who knew God's plan better than anyone (for He is God), still wept at Lazarus' death.

A Few Odds and Couple of Ends

Pastor Sean often has more to share with us than he is able to fit in his sermon on Sundays. Here he shares "a few odds and couple ends" for our further understanding and contemplation.

When we hear the word 'predestination' some of us may think about John Calvin. But the idea is in scripture, and was first elaborated on by the church father Augustine. Augustine has a whole book called 'On the Predestination of the Saints,', and in it he shows us how our being saved from sin and death is *entirely* God's gracious gift. Sometimes we also think about evangelism together with predestination. Does predestination make evangelism pointless? Hardly! J. I. Packer's wonderful book, *Evangelism and the Sovereignty of God*, shows how God's promise that He will bring people to Himself should encourage us to go out and evangelize, for God is doing the saving work with us!
