Worship: September 29

"The God who made the world and everything in it is the Lord of heaven and earth and does not live in temples built by human hands. And he is not served by human hands, as if he needed anything. Rather, he himself gives everyone life and breath and everything else."

Acts 17:24-25



This week Sean preached from Acts 17 and Paul's address to the Areopagus council in Athens/ Connecting this passage to Jesus' words in John 4, Sean encouraged us to worship God in Spirit (with our hearts, and not just following rituals), to worship God in Truth (not worshipping idols or fake versions of God), and to worship God in and through Christ (whom God raised from the dead, and whose resurrection gives us assurance that God will judge the world).

A Few Odds and Couple of Ends

Pastor Sean often has more to share with us than he is able to fit in his sermon. Here he shares "a few odds and couple ends" for our further understanding and contemplation.

Paul in his message to the Greek philosophers in Athens uses what theologians call "General Revelation". General revelation refers to how God's attributes and even character are evident from His creation. God reveals himself this way, but He more fully reveals Himself in 'Special Revelation,' which includes His appearing to Old Testament figures (called 'Theophanies'), His speaking through prophets, and above all His written Word. We ought to use both aspects of God's revelation in our apologetic and evangelistic efforts.








MEN'S MINISTRY NEWS
