



This Week at FPC

Worship: October 20

"While Apollos was at Corinth, Paul took the road through the interior and arrived at Ephesus. There he found some disciples and asked them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you believed?"

They answered, "No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit." So Paul asked, "Then what baptism did you receive?" "John's baptism," they replied.

Paul said, "John's baptism was a baptism of repentance. He told the people to believe in the one coming after him, that is, in Jesus." On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus."

Acts 19:1-5



This week Sean preached from Acts 19:1-22. In this passage we see four indicators, or signs, that someone is truly on the way of Jesus: true baptism in the name of the Lord Jesus for the forgiveness of sins, the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit and its fruit in our lives, a confession of Jesus as Lord not just with our lips but with our hearts, and our turning our backs on sinful habits and practices in our lives.

A Few Odds and Couple of Ends

Pastor Sean often has more to share with us than he is able to fit in his sermon. Here he shares "a few odds and couple ends" for our further understanding and contemplation.

The events of Acts 19 occur around the same time that the Apostle Paul wrote 1 Corinthians. This helps us connect Paul's comments in 1 Corinthians 13 that the gift of tongues will cease. While I believe that God performs miracles today, I see in Paul's writings and Acts indicators that the 'supernatural sign gifts' were limited to the age of the Apostles, and were for the purpose of confirming the gospel as it first spread throughout the world. Even if Christians may disagree about this, we can certainly agree with Paul's own statement that "If I speak in the tongues of men or of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal." As we examine our lives for the fruit of the Spirit, let's prioritize love of God and neighbor over anything else.






Thank You Deidra!
