"On the first day of the week we came together to break bread. Paul spoke to the people and, because he intended to leave the next day, kept on talking until midnight... Then he went upstairs again and broke bread and ate." Acts 20:7, 11

The First (And 8th) Day of the Week

This week Sean preached from Acts 20:1-16. In this passage, Paul preaches to a group of disciples and breaks bread with them, showing us that the first day of the week, Sunday, is the Lord's Day, and its purpose is for feasting on the God's Word and the Lord's Supper.

A Few Odds and Couple of Ends

Pastor Sean often has more to share with us than he is able to fit in his sermon. Here he shares "a few odds and couple ends" for our further understanding and contemplation.

I argued on Sunday that we as Christians fulfill the 4th commandment and keep the Sabbath when we gather as the people of God to worship Him on His day. Does this mean we violate the fourth commandment whenever we miss church on Sunday? I think a better way to think about this is examining our general pattern of faithful church attendance. Do we make a regular effort to be with God's people? And, of course, God is gracious and understands our individual situations if we are unable to regularly gather with others on Sunday morning due to commitments at work or reasons of health.
