"Then Paul answered, "Why are you weeping and breaking my heart? I am ready not only to be bound, but also to die in Jerusalem for the name of the Lord Jesus."

Acts 21:13

The Lord's Will Be Done, in Life, Prison, Death, or Any Circumstance

This week Sean preached from Acts 21:1-36. In this passage, the disciples, after being hesitant, finally allow Paul to go to Jerusalem. AS they let him leave, they (somewhat exasperated) say "The Lord's Will Be Done." Here were five ways God's will was on display in this passage: prophecy reveals it, prayers asks for it, praise celebrates it, purification demonstrates it, and persecution fulfills it.

A Few Odds and Couple of Ends

Pastor Sean often has more to share with us than he is able to fit in his sermon. Here he shares "a few odds and couple ends" for our further understanding and contemplation.

Paul clearly demonstrates his commitment to the Old Testament and its commands in this passage. Do you value the Old Testament? Do you turn to it for guidance and instruction? We cannot just abandon the Old Testament, even if the way it applies to us as Christians is different from the way it applied to the nation of Israel.













"And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God."

Ephesians 3:17b-19
