## The Birth of the One Mediator Between the One God and Humankind

This week, Sean preached from 1 Timothy 2:1-7. This passage teaches us that God is one, holy, and inclusive. In response, let us pray to God through Christ for All.

### A Few Odds and Couple of Ends

Pastor Sean often has more to share with us than he is able to fit in his sermon. Here he shares "a few odds and couple ends" for our further understanding and contemplation.

This passage teaches us about the radical exclusivity AND inclusivity of the gospel of Jesus Christ. It is exclusive, in that there is only one God and only one way to that one God, His one and only Son (which Jesus also says when he remarks that he is the way, the truth, and the life, and that no one can come to Father except through him). But the gospel is also inclusive, for God desires all to come to Him through His son, Jew and Gentile alike.


Volunteers are needed to help prepare the FPC facilities for worship and special services. Flexible
